INTRODUCTION :

Pompei College is a Religious and Linguistic Minority Institution founded in 1981 by Late Rev. Fr Bernard L. D'Souza in order to provide education primarily to the youth of this area. It also fulfills the aspirations of higher education of the locality adding to the cultural content of the society by imparting academic and value education to students of all castes and creeds without distinction. The Catholic Board of Education, Mangalore, manages the college. It is affiliated to Mangalore University. re- accredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade.

COLLEGE EDUCATION : POINTS TO REMEMBER

The aim of every college is the integral development of every student. In order to attain this goal, every student shall put in sincere efforts in studies and the fullest possible involvement in extra-curricular activities.

Curricular Studies:

1. Students should have a well planned and a neat personal time table for day-to-day study. A student has to study at least 2-3 hours on every working day and at least 4-5 hours on holidays. As study minded, student will complete his/her day to day home work sincerely without copying from others. In the college he/she will spend his/her free time in the library reading the reference books, journals and preparing notes.
2. The students are expected to maintain a Diary in which he / she shall record the following:
 - a) Date wise syllabus/ topics dealt in the class by the Lecturers concerned.
 - b) Reference books suggested by the Lecturers.

- c) Date-wise record of library books / journals referred. This record will help the students to fill up the different proforma and annexures to be filled and submitted to the lecturers once in a week.
3. The students should be attentive in the class room. For clarification of any doubt they may contact the lecturers concerned during the free time.
4. Regular study-habit is essential to achieve the best; such students will not have fear of the examinations. They will not have mental tension and load during examination days.
5. A student will attend all the classes of the day. No student will leave the class in between without the permission of the Principal and if, he/she wants to leave in between the classes, the student must get permission from the Principal and the concerned Class Teacher.
6. **Leave note** must be shown to the Class Teacher first on being absent to the class for his signature and then, it must be shown to all the concerned subject teachers and they in turn will put their initials in the respective columns before attending the class. Students who are absent for three or more than three days should show the leave note to the Principal. No student will attend the class without the leave note shown to the concerned teachers. The leave note must be signed by parents / guardians. The leave notes are very important as they stand as the proof of their attendance.

EXTRA AND CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The Students' Welfare Council of the College shall be directed by the Students' Welfare Officer and constituted by a male and a female Representative of each class. It shall assist the staff in organizing the extra-curricular activities of the college.

Extra-curricular activities such as N.S.S., N.C.C., Sports & Games, Cultural and Value Education activities, Literary Programmes, Guest Lecturer, Seminars etc. will develop the total development of the students body and mind. The college expects every student to involve in one or the other extra and co-curricular activity.

The College Library has more than 25,320 books and a spacious Reading Room with sufficient journals.

1. The Library will be kept open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on all working days except on Saturdays. On Saturdays the working hours will be from 9.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m.
2. Students are requested to produce their Identity Cards at the counter before entering the Library.
3. Students shall enter the Reading Room keeping their belongings on the racks kept at the entrance.
4. Only one exercise book or sheets of paper will be allowed to be taken inside the library.
5. Students shall write their names and roll numbers clearly in the register kept at the entrance of the Library / Reading Room.
6. Strict silence should be maintained inside the Library.
7. Books may be borrowed using prescribed borrowing slips for application.

8. Students are allowed to keep the borrowed books with them for a maximum period of one week.
9. Library has a Book Bank that lends books to the students for each semester period.
10. Books borrowed may be returned /renewed before 1.15 p.m. on all working days and on Saturdays before 11.30 a.m.
11. Books and periodicals borrowed for overnight must be returned before 9.30 a.m. on the subsequent working day for which application must be given in hand before 1.15 p.m. except on Saturdays, on Saturdays before 11.00 a.m.
12. Late return of the books will be penalised by a fine of ₹ 2.00 per day per book and ₹ 3.00 for the books borrowed for overnight.
13. The library books borrowed by the students are to be taken care from marking, underlining, highlighting, scribbling or dog earring the books.
14. Students borrowing the book must scrutinise the book and if any report to the librarian before borrowing the book. If the damage is detected or reported at the time of return of the books the cost of the book shall be paid by the borrower.
15. Sub-lending of the Library books is strictly forbidden.
16. Current Periodicals, Journals, Question Paper Files and Reference Books are not permitted to be taken out of the Library.
17. Students should produce their Reference Borrower's Ticket while borrowing books / Question paper files for reference in the Library.
18. If the students need any clarifications they may contact the Librarian.

SPORTS AND GAMES

The college has two spacious playgrounds and a good collection of sports materials. It also has well maintained Gymnasias. The students are required to make the best use of these facilities.

1. To encourage sportsmanship, inter-class competitions will be held from time to time. All the students are requested to participate in these competitions.
2. The Games Secretary shall be nominated by the Principal. The Games Secretary is responsible to collect and return the games materials.
3. The students may collect games materials through the Games Secretary.
4. College teams willing to participate in tournaments and sports meets should put in regular and systematic practice. The Principal may allow the team to participate in the tournaments considering the team's practice, capacity and general behaviour of the members of the team. Students are not allowed to play in any team against the college team.
5. It is a part of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities and are given maximum 50 marks as per the university regulations.

ADD ON COURSES

The college conducts add on courses. They are both for the U.G. as well as P.G. Courses.

G.S.T., Computer, Karate, Communicative English, Gardening, Data Analysis, Solid Waste Management, Rainwater Harvesting.

N.C.C

The college has a Naval N.C.C. unit with an intake capacity of 50. Lady students may also join N.C.C.. While selecting the candidates general health, personality and attitude will be considered. Regular coaching will be held on Saturday afternoon. N.C.C Certificates may help the students for getting admission to higher course or obtaining job. It is a part of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.

N.S.S.

N.S.S unit of Mangalore University has the intake capacity of 100 students and it is a part of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.

Students of I and II Degree classes may register their names with the officer concerned in the beginning of the year. N.S.S. unit will organize week end half day camps, one day camp inside the college and its surroundings. 7days special camp will be organized during mid-term vacation. Apart from its usual service activities it also arranges guest lecturer, leadership and awareness programmes, personality development programmes and debates on different relevant topics.

CULTURAL ASSOCIATION

Cultural Committee will organize and train the students to produce quality entertainment programmes. It deputed the best talented students/ teams to inter-college competitions. Literary Committee trains and guides the interested students to write articles which may be published in the Wall Magazine and College Magazine.

Youth Red Cross: Youth Red Cross unit apart from its usual service activities, organises health and hygiene programmes, guest lectures and environmental awareness programmes. It is a part of EC & CC activities.

STUDY TOUR AND RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

The lecturers may arrange educational tours to historical, cultural or industrial areas. By attending these tours the students will have a practical knowledge of the subjects taught in the class rooms. Strict discipline and serious involvement is expected of the students in these tours.

PLACEMENT & INTERNSHIP

College provides opportunities for campus selection, Placement, Soft skill training, Internship opportunities in reputed organizations.

DISCIPLINE AND BEHAVIOUR

1. All students will wear uniform on all the days of the College. Students must wear the uniform in proper manner. The college uniform must be stitched as per the design given by the college. A student who is found not wearing uniform and ID will be fined ₹ 100/-. Suppose a student repeat the same mistake parents will be informed and disciplinary action will be taken.
2. During holidays/College/Institutional celebrations students will wear uniform while being present in the campus.

3. No student shall bring mobiles/ cell phones in the college campus/ class rooms even during the non-working days and for any function in the college. Bringing storage electronic gadgets, bluetooth, phone connected wrist watches, ear phones etc are not allowed.
4. Students coming by public transport shall behave properly with the fellow passengers, drivers, conductors, etc. Picking up quarrels, raising voice and indecent behaviour in the public transport or in the streets will spoil the reputation of the College.
5. **No eatables are allowed inside the class rooms i.e. chocolates, chew-gums or any other home-made/ bakery items. If found, eating and the wrappers found inside the class/ desks/ classrooms, concerned class/ student is responsible, and the class will be fined. Keeping classroom clean and tidy is the duty and responsibility of every student and class.**
6. No student is allowed to bring two wheelers and four wheelers to the College campus without the prior permission of the Principal and if need to bring request letter from their parents is required. DL is compulsory. Two wheeler riders should wear helmet and should follow all the traffic rules and regulations.
7. No student is permitted to celebrate any religious festivals / arrange class gatherings /class picnics/ get-togethers without the permission of the Principal.
8. Picnics and educational tours are to be organized with the prior permission of the Principal. For all such programmes the written permission of the parents is required.
9. The Working Hours of the college:
Forenoon Session: 9.00 a.m to 1.00 p.m
Afternoon Session: 1.45 p.m to 4.30 p.m
A certain number of classes/tutorials/tests/mentoring/ remedial classes will be held outside the working hours, for which attendance is compulsory. Students are expected to be in the campus at least five minutes prior the commencement of the sessions. Zero hour classes will begin at 9 A.M.

10. At 9.55 a.m and at 1.40 p.m first bell will be given. Soon after the first bell the students shall move to their respective class rooms silently and shall await for the lecturers to enter the class soon after the second bell. After the prayer, the classes will commence. **No student is permitted to come out the class after the 1st hour in the morning and afternoon.**
11. Allowing the late comers to the class room or marking present will be the discretion of the concerned lecturer. No student shall leave the class room in the middle of the class hours except with the permission of the lecturer concerned / permission of the Principal.
12. The lecturers are empowered to instruct any student to change the place of sitting, without assigning any reason.
13. Any argument about class room discipline will not be allowed inside the classroom. However they may present their opinion with the lecturers after the class hour in their departments.
14. Students are expected to wish / salute the staff members on their first meeting of the day.
15. Students are not expected to loiter in the college campus or corridor unnecessarily.
16. Whistling, making obscene sounds, raising the voice, haggling together in the corridor and campus is strictly prohibited, especially during lunch break.
17. Students are expected to spend their free time in the library /games room or with the lecturers discussing the subject.
18. **Every student should possess/wear his/her Identity Card issued by the college in the campus which should be produced whenever asked for.**

19. Students are not permitted to smoke or use of tobacco in any form, in the campus. They are also forbidden to bring video games gadgets, transistor radios, cell/cordless phones, musical instruments etc., to the college.
Consumption of alcohol in the campus or entering the campus after alcohol consumption shall be an offence, punishable even with suspension or dismissal from the college.
20. Books, Magazines, Newspapers etc., not approved by the Principal, should not be brought to the college.
21. Students are requested not to bring heavy cash or valuables to the college.
22. Students must converse in English or Kannada with their fellow students and with the teachers. Teachers shall not speak to the students in any other language except English, Kannada or Hindi.
23. Students are not permitted to celebrate the birthdays of teachers/students in the campus.

RULES OF GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Causing disturbance within the College premises, Library, Reading Room, Common Room, Playground, diverting attention of the students from the Lecturers, or of a teacher from teaching, insubordination and disrespect to the teachers within or outside college premises, habitual inattention to class work, frequent absence, disturbing a class from outside, loitering in the corridors, making noise and disturbing the classes, picking a quarrel with the staff – teaching or non-teaching or with other students, and any other act or acts which the Principal may deem as minor acts of indiscipline. Punishment for these acts of indiscipline may range from issue of warning, suspension from class and keeping the offender out of class for consecutive 4 periods by the concerned lecturers, imposition of fine or even suspension from the college for a period of seven working days at a time by the Principal.

2. Repetition of acts of indiscipline in spite of repeated warnings and penalties imposed, attending and the college dressed in a manner contrary to social norms prevailing from time to time, indecent exposure in a provocative manner, disfiguring the walls, floors, furniture etc., of the college by writing offensive and indecent slogans, destruction of the college properties, instigating others to commit acts of indiscipline, organization of movements subversive of discipline of the college, physical intimidation of law-abiding students, indulging in criminal acts of any kind, rousing communal and caste feelings among students, demonstration of disloyalty to the country, its constitution and its flag, ragging of any kind of tending to cause physical and mental torture attending the college in a drunken state, bringing to the college instruments like whistles, toys with the intention of creating noise and disturbing the peace of the college, bringing and playing cassettes or radios inside the class or outside the class hours, smoking in the college campus and any other act or acts which the Principal may consider as major acts of indiscipline, are major acts of indiscipline.

Students indulging in these major acts of indiscipline are liable to be suspended from the college or the parents / guardian may be asked to withdraw the student from the college or rustication of the student from the college.

3. Attendance to moral, religious and value education classes/ retreat and all extra-curricular & co-curricular programmes is compulsory.
4. Students shall not take part in political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. They are also forbidden to engage prominently in any public movement without the permission of the Principal.
5. Students shall not join clubs, associations or organizations, the activities of which may interfere with their regular studies in the college without the permission of the Principal.
5. Students are not permitted to take photos of any college programme/class room without the permission of the organizers/principal

7. The college is not responsible for the conduct of the students outside the college premises. However, any misconduct of the students outside the college premises which is likely to bring disrepute to the college will be viewed seriously by the Principal and the students concerned are liable to be punished as the Principal deems fit.

Clause : 3

What Constitutes Ragging ? : Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student.
- c. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.

- f. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
- g. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it : sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.
- h. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i. Any act that affects the mental health and self - confidence of a fresher or any other student. With or without an intention to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Clause : 7

Action to be taken by the Head of the institution : On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorised by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i. Abetment to ragging
- ii. Criminal conspiracy to ragging
- iii. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- iv. Public nuisance created during ragging
- v. Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- vi. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- vii. Wrongful restraint
- viii. Wrongful confinement
- ix. Use of criminal force

- x. Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
- xi. Extortion
- xii. Criminal trespass
- xiii. Offences against property
- xiv. Criminal intimidation
- xv. Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- xvi. Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- xvii. Physical or psychological humiliation
- xviii. All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'

Clause : 9

Administrative action in the event of ragging :

- 9.1. The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in number :
 - a. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
 - b. The Anti-ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely
 - i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
 - ii. Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
 - iii. Debarring from appearing in any test / examination or other evaluation process
 - iv. Withholding results
 - v. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
 - vi. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.

- vii. Cancellation of admission.
- viii. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

The Choice Based Credit System for the Bachelor of Degree Programmes in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Technology and Commerce introduced from the Academic Year 2019-20

The Salient Features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) (Semester Scheme):

Each course in a programme shall carry certain number of credits, which normally represent the weightage of a course and are a function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, etc. In the proposed programmes, in general, 2 hours of instructions per week in a semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a semester. On the basis of these parameters, a three year degree programme will have a maximum of 100 or 104 credits.

The other features of the CBCS (Semester Scheme) are

- i. The 'Degree Course' is to be replaced by 'Degree Programme' and the term 'Subject/Paper' is to be replaced by 'Course'.
- ii. The Under Graduate degree programmes are structured on Choice Based Credit System (Semester Scheme).
- iii. The relative importance of courses of study and activities are quantified in terms of Credits. Total credit of the programme is in the range of 100-104.
- iv. Each programme of study will have "Core courses (Group-I)", "Electives (Group-II)", "Foundation courses (Group-III)" –and "Extra and Co-curricular Activities (Group-IV)".

The Core courses (Group -I) will consist of compulsory/optional courses which are compulsorily studied by a student in all six semesters, whereas Elective and Foundation courses are to be studied in I to IV Semesters.

Elective courses are:

- a. Supportive to the discipline of study.
- b. Providing an expanded scope.
- c. Nurturing student's proficiency/skill.
- d. Enabling an exposure to some other discipline/domain.

The student shall opt any one of the elective courses (a to d) in each semester. The Foundation course will consist of Compulsory Foundation and Elective Foundation. Two languages are compulsory foundation, whereas i) Constitution of India, ii) Human Rights, iii) Gender and Equity, iv) Environmental Studies are Elective Foundation courses which shall be studied by a student in any of I-IV semester by opting any one in each semester.

v) The declaration of result is based on the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) earned towards the end of each semester and the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned towards the end of the programme with corresponding alpha-sign grade. However, the Grade card will also consist of marks secured by the student. Hence, it will be called as Marks cum Grade card.

v. Credits:

Group I - Core courses I-IV Semester-9/10 credits in each Sem.
V-VI Semester-18 credits in each Sem.

Group II-Elective courses I-IV Semester-1 credit in each Sem.

Group III-Foundation courses

(a) Compulsory Foundation I-IV Semester -4credits in each Sem.

(b) Elective Foundation I-IV Semester -1 credit in each Sem.

Group IV-Extra and Co-curricular I-IV Semester -1 credit in each Sem. Activities.

NEP (National Education Policy)

The NEP guidelines are applicable for 1st Degree Students (2021-22 batch) only. University has given new/revised guidelines for awarding I.A. marks under NEP.

RULES OF ATTENDANCE

Once a student enters the college campus he/she should attend all the classes of the day. However, if any student needs to be absent from any class he/she should obtain the prior permission of the Principal or the concerned teacher. Students violating this rule are liable to pay a fine of Rs 50/- each time.

Absentees should justify their absence with the Principal before attending class on the subsequent day.

a) ATTENDANCE AND CHANGE OF COURSES:

A candidate shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for a semester if he/she attends not less than 75% of the number of classes actually held up to the end of the semester in each of the courses. There shall be a minimum of 75% attendance requirement for the Extra-and Co-Curricular Activities opted by the candidate as per clause.

A candidate who does not satisfy the requirement of attendance even in one course shall not be eligible to take the whole University examination of that semester and he/she shall seek re-admission to that Semester of that programme in a subsequent year.

Option to change a course is exercisable only once within a week from the date of commencement of the first Semester on payment of fee prescribed by the University. Whenever a change in a course is permitted the attendance in the changed course shall be calculated by taking into consideration the attendance in the previous course studied by the candidate.

If a candidate represents his/her institution/University/ Karnataka State/ Nation in Sports/ NCC/ NSS/ Cultural or any officially sponsored activities he/she may be permitted to claim attendance for actual number of days participated including the travel period, based on the recommendation of the Head of the Institution concerned. If a candidate participates in national level events such as Republic Day Parade/NSS/EBSB etc., he/she may be permitted to claim attendance for actual number of days participated including the travel period based on the necessary certificates and recommendation of the head of the Institution concerned.

- b) A candidate who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance even in one subject shall not be permitted to take the whole University Examination of that year and he shall be required to repeat the course in a subsequent year.
- c) The students are at liberty to contact their teachers to know about their attendance status.
- d) **The students & parents will be informed every month during the semester regarding the shortage of attendance. It is very important that the parents constantly monitor the attendance of their children. The parents are required to meet the Principal regularly and enquire about the shortage of attendance.**

TESTS AND EXAMINATIONS

Regular tests will be conducted in every subject. The students are required to answer these tests in right earnest. Similarly absence for any reason will not be viewed lightly.

The progress of the students in their curricular studies will be reported to their parents / guardians. The progress report of the students is sent to their parents/guardians after the end of each Test and should be returned to the concerned Class Teacher after affixing their signature there on.

N.B. :

1. All the students are expected to be present for all the examinations without fail.
2. The absentees for the examination will not be granted re-examination without prior approval.
3. **Only serious medical emergencies and the like will be considered for re-examination, with a payment of fine Rs 100/- per subject.**

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Two tests for Internal assessment will be conducted in each semester and they will be of one and two hours of duration respectively. If a student fails to appear for any of the tests for a valid reason as judged by the Principal he/ she will be given a chance to appear for another test of two hours duration at the end of each semester on payment of a prescribed fee of Rs 100/- per subject.

- NUMBER OF ATTEMPTS ALLOWED - FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

A candidate, who fails to successfully complete the programme within a period of three years after admission, shall be allowed to complete the programme within the next three years, within a total period of six years from the year of admission.

The Repeaters are required to confirm the prescribed syllabus and note the changes, if any, while applying for the supplementary examinations.

All scholarships and Fee concessions are subject to good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress.
